FROM THE PODIUM A letter from the President

I will spend the next three and a half years doing everything I can to work with anyone -- Democrat, Republican, or independent -- to fight for middle class families.

July 9, 2014 Speakers

We were welcomed to our second meeting this year at the IBEW-NECA Technical Institute, better known as the apprentice school to us *old guys*, by John Donahue the director. John has been at the school for 22years now. We congratulate him and his staff on a remarkable program; it is a far cry from the old Washburne Trade School days.

John had some encouraging remarks as to the impending work picture; his feeling is that work will be picking up and that the unemployed numbers are slowly dropping. We currently have approximately 600 apprentices enrolled vs. our high of 2500. He pointed out however, that the numbers of apprentices never matched the rate of attrition of the local.

He also stated that people can sign up year round on Wednesdays at the school. The tests are quarterly, so a person will know in a few months if they may be accepted. There is no longer a "long term" list. Thank you for your time John.

Screen Safe Director, Jim Heffernan was our scheduled speaker and he took the time to explain that Local 134 was the first local that they represented back in 2001. Jim had been a business manager for one of the Commonwealth Edison locals before they merged as local 15 IBEW. He was involved in the writing of the Com Ed drug program. Screen Safe now represents a large number of IBEW locals as well as other trades.

Local 48, IBEW was the model that our program had used when it was implemented. He pointed out that nothing is *failsafe*; we have had a good track record. He also stated that other IBEW locals are even more restrictive. Jim also was asked about the "legalization" of "medical marijuana" and his answer was that zero tolerance is absolute. It is still the right of the employer to set the shop policies.

Jim Fliris, Jim Heffernan and I have all had many different experiences over the years, some funny and some very sad. We all know the repercussions of drug and alcohol abuse. Thank you, Jim, for your time and insight.

RECIPE EXCHANGE

I often purchase a cooked roasted chicken for dinner and since we get more than one meal out of it, I think it is a good buy. I have made stir fry, chicken salad, cream chicken over rice and many other menus. Today I have a new recipe for using cut-up chicken.

SOUR CREAM ENCHILADAS

1 pkg (12) 10" flour tortillas (room temp.)

1 can green chilies, chopped

2 cans cream of chicken soup

½ can water

1/4 cup chopped onion

1 lb. cheddar cheese, grated

8 oz. sour cream

cut-up chicken

Preheat oven at 350 degrees.

Saute onion in butter until tender. Add green chilies, soup, sour cream and ½ can water. Heat to boiling. Add Chicken and simmer until chicken is warm. Put hot mixture evenly on the tortillas using all of the chicken and sprinkle with ½ of the cheese. Roll up and place in a 9' x 13" pan. When pan is full, pour remaining hot liquidly mixture on top and sprinkle with remaining cheese. Heat at 350 degrees until cheese melts.







DRIVING DIRECTIONS

FROM THE EAST (Downtown Chicago)

- Take I-290 WEST (Eisenhower Expressway)
- Meep LEFT to take I-88 WEST (Ronald Reagan Memorial Tollway) toward AURORA.
- Take the SPRING RD/CERMAK RD/22ND ST EXIT.
- Proceed STRAIGHT at stoplight crossing over CERMAK RD/22ND ST, this will be SPRING RD.
- Follow SLIGHT RIGHT on SPRING RD. (Watch for Green Sign "Drury Lane/Hilton".)
- Turn LEFT onto DRURY UN.
- End at 100 Drury Lane, Oakbrook Terrace.

FROM THE WEST

- Take I-88 EAST (Ronald Reagan Memorial Tollway) toward Chicago.
- Take the MIDWEST RD Exit.
- M Keep right at the fork to go on MIDWEST RD/CR-15.
- Turn RIGHT onto BUTTERFIELD RD/IL-56.
- Take the ROOSEVELT RD/IL-38 EAST ramp toward DRURY LN.
- Take the DRURY LN/SPRING RD ramp toward SOUTH.
- Turn SLIGHT RIGHT onto SPRING RD.
- Turn RIGHT onto DRURY LANE.
- End at 100 Drury Lane, Oakbrook Terrace.

FROM THE SOUTH (ON IL-83/KINGERY HWY)

- Take IL-83/KINGERY HWY NORTH
- Merge onto IL-56/BUTTERFIELD RD EAST TOWARD IL-38 E/ROOSEVELT RD.
- Take the ROOSEVELT RD/IL-38 E ramp toward Drury Lane.
- Take the DRURY LN/SPRING RD ramp toward SOUTH
- Turn slight right onto SPRING RD.
- Turn RIGHT onto DRURY LN.
- End at 100 Drury Lane, Oakbrook Terrace.

FROM THE SOUTH (ON 1-294)

- Take I-294 NORTH toward WISCONSIN.
- Merge onto i-88 WEST (Ronald Reagan Memorial Tollway) toward AURORA.
- Take the SPRING RD/CERMAK RD/22ND ST EXIT.
- Proceed STRAIGHT at stoplight crossing over CERMAK RD/22ND ST,
- this will be SPRING RD.
- Follow SLIGHT RIGHT on SPRING RD. (Watch for Green Sign "Drury Lane/Hilton".)
- Turn LEFT onto DRURY LN.
- End at 100 Drury Lane, Oakbrook Terrace.

FROM THE NORTH

- Take I-294 SOUTH toward iNDIANA-O'HARE (Portions toll).
- Merge onto I-88 WEST (Ronald Reagan Memorial Tollway) toward AURORA.
- Take the exit toward IE-83 NORTH/CERMAK RD-22ND ST.
- Turn SLIGHT RIGHT onto SPRING RD.
- Turn LEFT onto DRURY LN.
- End at 100 Drury Lane, Oakbrook Terrace.
