#### FROM THE PODIUM

There was another Life Insurance Committee meeting on February 18<sup>th</sup> at the apprentice school Business Manager Don Finn started the meeting. He explained that the decision of our Met Life insurance policy would be made by the membership, consisting of active members and retirees. The Thursday April 2nd union meeting will have explanations of what the life insurance committee has discussed. On April 4<sup>th</sup> a letter of explanation from the Business Manager will be mailed to the membership. Retiree Ed Pierce who was an active contributor to the committee meetings will also send the membership a letter on April 6<sup>th</sup>. On April 9<sup>th</sup> ballots to choose among the options will be mailed to the membership. The ballots are due by April 24<sup>th</sup>.

Office Manager Tim Fitzgibbons spoke of the options that we were to choose from. The first option was to keep the benefits and the cost the way they are right now which is \$7500 till age 65 then \$5000 till age 70 when it becomes \$3750. The cost is \$15 a quarter for active members, an annual premium of \$60 a year for retirees. The second option is everyone both active and retirees get the same \$7500 benefit at the new rate of \$33 per quarter or an annual premium of \$132 per year for retirees. The third option is \$10,000 for active members and \$7500 for retirees. The premium will be \$33.25 per quarter and the annual premium for retirees will be an annual premium of \$133.

After the ballots are counted the decision will not go into effect till January 1<sup>st</sup> 2016. The reason being to break an existing plan and restart would cost from \$230,000 to \$400,000 adding another increase to the premium. The new plan would be locked in for three years, when an increase in premium is expected. What we must remember is that having a large membership affords us, no matter what option we choose a good benefit at a reasonable cost.





### February 11<sup>th</sup> 2015 Speaker

On February 11<sup>th</sup> we were honored to have speakers from Honor Flight Chicago, I was unaware that they were going to be here when I put the note in our last newsletter.

The speakers were Pat Ischinger and Dave Dionne, both volunteers for Honor Flight. They walked us through a typical flight that leaves from Midway Air Port the first Wednesday of the month. Each of the veterans is met at the air port and provided with new "dog tags", an honor flight shirt and hat and each has their own escort for the day. The day starts early with the flights leaving at approximately 7am. The vet is flown to Washington D.C. where they then tour the World War II Memorial, The Korean War Memorial and The Viet Nam Wall. Everything is provided meals, snacks, beverages, transportation at *absolutely* no cost to the veteran or his family. On their flight home they are treated to "mail call" were they receive letters that have been written by people and students thanking them for their service and sacrifice. When they return to Midway they are greeted by the CFD water cannon salute, a high ranking military officer will salute them and when they enter the terminal they are greeted by better than 1000


people cheering them home. It has been a long day for the vet, perhaps 14 hours but they all say it was a "it was the best day of my life". Both had special moments, but Pat recalled one where, after a long day the vet's were returning and coming off the plane in wheel chairs due to the long walk, and when they saw the crowd there to greet them, they stopped the escort and those that were able; they got up and walked through the welcoming crowd.

This group wants to serve all WWII veterans that they can, so if you know of anyone who served let them know, there is no cost to the vet or his family! They will also take applications for Korean and Viet Nam vets.

Also as I mentioned in last month's article it requires about 1500 hours to get a flight put together, if you would like to volunteer get in touch with **Honor Flight.** They need help from anyone stuffing envelopes, making phone calls to greeters.



#### RECIPE EXCHANGE

### Pork Chop Skillet Dinner

4 pork loin or rib chops, 1 inch thick (1 ½ lb) 1/4 cup beef or chicken flavored broth 4 medium potatoes, cut into fourths 4 small carrots, cut into 2 inch pieces 4 medium onions, cut into fourths 3/4 teaspoon salt ¼ teaspoon pepper Chopped fresh parsley, if desired Remove fat from pork chops. Spray skillet with cooking spray; heat over medium-high heat. Cook pork in skillet about 5 minutes, turning once, until brown. Add broth, potatoes, carrots and onions to skillet. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Heat to boiling and then reduce heat. Cover and simmer about 30 minutes or until vegetables are tender and pork is slightly pink when cut near bone. Sprinkle with parsley. Follow cook times for pork carefully. Today's pork is lean and requires shorter cook times. Overcooking pork will make it tough. Complete this home-style meal with purchased corn muffins and crisp apple slices drizzled with poppy seed dressing.

#### **APRIL 8th**




