# Illinois Alliance for Retired Americans Constitutional Convention

Before I go any further, I want to thank my predecessor Don Mahoney for his twenty-two years of service as Local 134 Retiree's Club Secretary. Don spent countless hours to record and preserve our history and remains committed to serving the Organization as Secretary Emeritus. I recently represented Local 134 Retiree's Club as a delegate to the Second Constitutional Convention of the Illinois Alliance for Retired Americans.

The convention was held on Saturday, September 23<sup>rd</sup> at the UAW Pat Greathouse Center situated high above the Illinois River in Ottawa. The convention included speakers from the Illinois Alliance for Retired Americans (IARA), our umbrella group. There was an election of the organization's leadership, as well as presentations on federal and state issues affecting seniors.

I came away from the day mindful of the need to give back for all the benefits we continue to enjoy, due in large to the efforts of those who preceded us. Of note, INTERGEN, an intergenerational alliance bringing together retirees, young activists and students, was recently launched through leadership of the Chicago-Metro Retires, a chapter of the Illinois Alliance for Retired Americans. Bea Lumpkin, active in the Chicago-Metro Retirees and IARA, reported to the convention on the launch of INTERGEN. Bea was instrumental in the formation of INTERGEN. Bea is ninety-nine years old. It's never too late to give back.

#### FROM THE POPE

Pope Francis delivered another criticism of some members of his own Church, suggesting it is better to be an atheist than one of "many" Catholics who he said lead a hypocritical double life.

In improvised comments in the sermon of his private morning Mass in his residence, he said "There are those who say 'I am very Catholic, I always go to Mass, I belong to this and that association" the head of the 1.2 billionmember Roman Catholic Church said, according to a Vatican Radio transcript.

He said that some of these people should also say "my life is not Christian, I don't pay my employees proper salaries, I exploit people, I do dirty business, I launder money, (I lead) a double life. "There are many Catholics who are like this and they cause scandal," he said. How many times have we all heard people say "if that person is a Catholic, it is better to be an atheist."

Since his election in 2013, Francis has often told Catholics, both priests and lay people, to practice what their religion preaches.

In his often impromptu sermons, he has condemned sexual abuse of children by priests as being tantamount to a "Satanic Mass", said Catholics in the mafia excommunicate themselves, and told his own cardinals to not act as if they were "princes".

Less than two months after his election, he said Christians should see atheists as good people if they do good. "It is a scandal to say one thing and do another. That is a double life."


